

STONEHENGE APOLLO EARTH QUILT

I used a total of 7 panels – 6 for the main part of the center and 1, I cut up and used it in various parts of the outer border.

2 yds Stonehenge #3964, color 167 for 8-1/2" borders (cut 9")

 $\frac{1}{2}$ yd Stonehenge #3954, color 168 for (4) inner border corner squares, 9" x 9" (cut 9-1/2" x 9-1/2")

- 1. Take four of the panels, and trim the border section off of one side, saving the border pieces to add later. These four panels became the two top and two bottom pieces.
- 2. Take three of the panels, and trim the borders off both top and bottom, and save them for later. Two of these panels become the center piece, and the other I used later (I'll describe that when I get to it.)
- 3. -All of these sections need to be trimmed width wise to the same width.
- 4. Sew each top, middle, bottom section together, and then sew each unit together, so you have 6 printed medallions with borders on top and bottom.
- 5. Take 5 of the border sections that you cut off the panels and join them end to end. Repeat with the other 5 sections.
- 6. -Measure side of quilt top. Since you will be adding $9-1/2^{\circ}$ squares at each end, you will cut the border section 19" less than the quilt top. Add a 9-1/2" square to each end of side border and apply to each side of the quilt.
- 7. I thought the outer border was too boring, so I cut the filigree parts of the corners off the last panel and appliqued them to the centers of the long outer borders before I added them to the quilt top.
- 8. I cut four 9" x 9" squares from the center of the rest of the last panel and used them as the outer border corner blocks.
